Digital Design COURSE SYLLABUS

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DESCRIPTION OF COURSE:

- Digital Design is the 2nd course for Web & Digital Design Pathway.
- Using web design as the platform for product design and presentation, students will create and learn digital media applications using elements of text, graphics, animation, sound, video and digital imaging for various formats. The digital media and interactive media projects developed and published showcase the student skills and ability. Emphasis will be placed on effective use of tools for interactive multimedia production including storyboarding, visual development, project management, digital citizenship, and web processes. Students will create and design web sites that incorporate digital media elements to enhance content of web site.
- Employability skills are integrated into activities, tasks, and projects throughout the course standards to demonstrate the skills required by business and industry. Topics covered will be: Attendance, Character, Teamwork, Appearance, Attitude, Productivity, Organization, Communication, Cooperation, and Respect.
